### DESCRIPTION

Homestay accommodation gives students the opportunity to experience the everyday life and customs of a local Argentine home. A homestay is the best option for those who want to practice their Spanish as much as possible, since students will share two daily meals with their hosts and will have plenty of opportunities to speak. This is our most popular housing option.

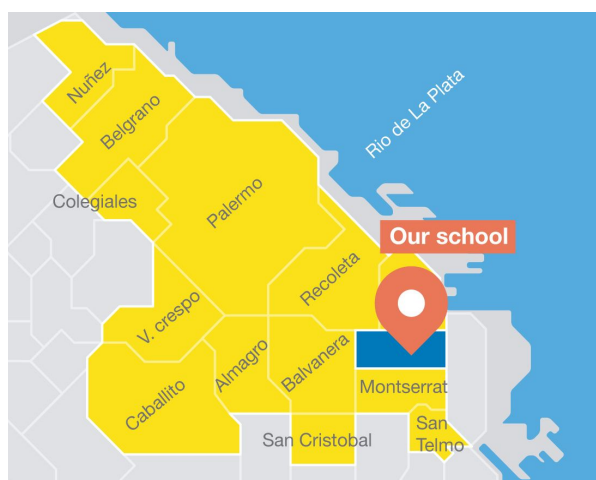
- Want to practice Spanish at home as much as possible

## LOCATION OF HOMESTAYS

Our homestays are located in the best and safest neighborhoods in the city and they will always be within a maximum of 40 minutes from the school. Example neighborhoods are San Telmo, Recoleta, Villa Crespo, Palermo, Belgrano and many more. They will always be within 5 blocks of public transportation (subway or bus) that comes directly to the school to make your daily commute as easy as possible.



## MATCHING STUDENTS TO A HOST

When students book a program with us we will ask if they object to living with smokers or house pets, and if they have any special needs like dietary restrictions or allergies. We can always guarantee these needs, and we will use them to assign students to a homestay. Students are more than welcome to include other special requests, like living in a specific neighborhood, and we will do our best to accommodate but cannot 100% guarantee them.

## WHO WILL STUDENTS LIVE WITH?

Students will live with a local Argentine family, which could be a couple or a single host, with or without children. In homestays, students will have someone at home to help them adjust to Argentina, share meals and to practice Spanish. Some hosts more than one student at a time, which means students could live with one or more other students as well.

**CHECK-IN AND CHECK-OUT**

- Check-in on Sundays after 12pm (noon)
- Check-out on Saturdays before 12pm (noon)

\*Students may not arrive to their housing before 8am without booking the room from the day before. If students arrive before check-in time, they may not be able to move into their room until after 12pm.

**NOTES**

- Students must inform the school of any dietary restrictions or allergies upon booking a homestay.
- Students will receive a key to the home upon arrival.
- Housing assignments are sent out 2 weeks before arrival.
